Go on and get creative Year 3! We are looking forward to receiving your finished pieces of work.

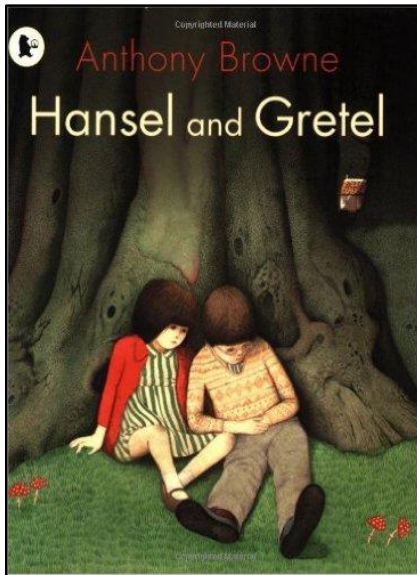
