Mr Spencer has written an example image poem below to help you. If you did not complete the task from last week, the instructions are on the next page to help you get started!

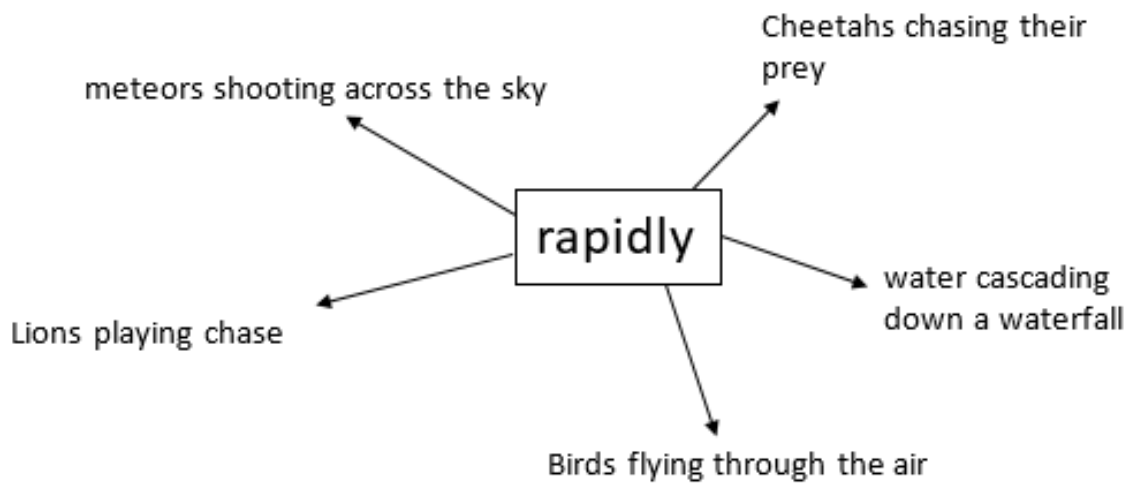
Peacefully, the garish sun began to peer over the horizon,
