

Seeds are often winged so they can be spread by the wind	Trees grow 25-45 metres in height	The air is damp and humid with little rainfall reaching the plants at this level	Plants have a difficult time with pollination because of lack of air movement
Trees reach 60m in height	Plants receive 2-15% of available sunlight	Plants rarely grow above 10m in height	Leaves have pointed tips for rain to drip off
Decomposing organic matter and leaf litter found here	Home to 90% of organisms found in the rainforest	Leaves are large to absorb as much light as possible	Plants rarely grow more than 3.5m in height
This layer is a layer of leaves around 6 metres thick	Almost no plants grow in this layer	Vines and creepers hitch a lift to sunlight on tree trunks	Animals = eagles, bats and monkeys
Tops of these trees can be almost the size of a football pitch	Only 1 or 2 in every acre of rainforest	Plants only get 1-2% of available sunlight	Animals = termites, cockroaches, earthworms, beetles, centipedes
