

It's Me, 1, 2, 3 Vocabulary

One	Only 'one' object.
Two	If you have one object, then you get one more, you will have 2. Two means you have a pair e.g. a pair of shoes or a pair of socks.
Three	If you have two objects and then you get one more, you have 3 objects.
Count	Say numbers one after the other in order. Point to or touch one object as you say each number.
Match	You put things that are similar together. You can match a number to a picture that shows the same amount of objects e.g. dots.
Sort	Put things together that are similar.
How Many?	The amount or number of things.
Numerals	A symbol that represents how many objects there are e.g. 1, 2 or 3.
Altogether	You put everything together and count it all in one go.
Pattern	A special way that things are arranged. Patterns follow a certain order e.g. adding one more each time.
Ten Frame	A special frame that helps to count and recognise numbers to 10. It has 10 boxes and we can put one object in each box.
1 More	Add one extra thing.
1 Less	Take away one thing.
Smaller Numbers	All numbers are made up of smaller numbers.
