

<p>Phonics</p> 	<p>Our reading opportunities will include:</p> <p>Retelling through acting/role play. Retelling stories using images / apps. Editing of story maps and orally retelling new stories. Sequence story – use vocabulary of beginning, middle and end. Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter– sound correspondences. Enjoying an increasing range of books. Using actions to retell the story. Creating our own story Maps.</p> <p>This half term is a busy one for our phonics as we will be coming to end of Phase 2 and beginning to look at phase 3.</p> <p>This term we will introduce:</p> <p>Phase 2/3 Unit 4: ck, e, u, r Unit 5: h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss Unit 6: j, v, w, x, Decodable words: mum, up, get, had, back, his, big, him, if, of, off, but, will HFW: he, to, I, go, no into, her, me, be</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>We will begin our first unit of Power maths and will be exploring:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Numbers within 5 (more and less than) • Number bonds to 5 • Spatial awareness • Numbers to 10 • Comparing numbers within 10 <p>We will also be looking at recognising numbers and the formation of numbers</p>
<p>Understanding of the World</p> 	<p>This half term we will begin by continuing to explore Autumn and our exciting texts will help us to do this. The children will have to opportunities to explore these through our roleplays below.</p> <p>Roleplay areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Indoor - Homecorner – The children will have the opportunity to roleplay alongside their friends to take on roles around the home, problem solve and work together. This half term we will introduce babies and a pet into our home corner. Later in the half term we will also create a birthday party theme. • Outdoor – Gruffalo/Autumn exploration – continuing to look at the signs of autumn, bringing in our texts ‘The Gruffalo and Owl babies’. The children will have opportunities to create their own Gruffalo crumble and their own little bird houses and feeders. We will also explore Autumn animals, especially looking at nocturnal animals • Pop up roleplays – these are roleplays that interest our children, this might mean we have a hairdressers, a builders yard, doctors, school and many more. We like to understand our children’s interests and use these within our play and learning.

<p>Physical</p>  	<p>This half term some of the opportunities we will explore to develop our fine motor and gross motor skills will include:</p> <p>Dough Disco Squiggle while you wiggle Fine motor opportunities –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sensory writing – foam, sand, rice, glitter etc. - Threading, cutting, weaving, playdough, Finger Gym/ chunky chalk activities. - Fine motor construction, nuts bolts, crazy creatures, mobile. - Large/small paint brush activities. - cutting activities <p>Gross motor opportunities –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Outdoor provision - Sandpit - Mud kitchen - Outdoor balancing equipment/obstacle equipment - Large paintbrushes and water - Large chalks - Weekly P.E <p>Self-care – Using the toilet independently, hand washing independently, being independent at lunch times, dressing and undressing for P.E and Forest schools.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Please bring P.E kits into school.</p>
<p>Magic Moments</p> 	<p>Please continue to send in "Magic Moments" using the evidence me app when you feel that your child has learnt anything new as this will allow us to provide next steps in their learning.</p>
<p>Reading</p> 	<p>Each week the children will have a focus story, a rhyme of the week (these will be found in our weekly parent newsletter)</p> <p>The children will also bring home a library book each week (Wednesday). This will need to be returned each week.
